Program Fees

This will vary by location. We suggest: \$800-\$2,200.

Housing

The housing fees will vary based on the exact accommodations you choose or in which you are placed.

Meals

You may have a meal plan or will purchase your own groceries for meals. Meal plans are usually the best deal. We suggest you should budget between \$75—\$100 per week or what you currently budget at home.

Books

The cost of books will vary by program and subject. We recommend about \$300-\$400 per semester.

Student Visa

Each country has different visa/immigration fees. Prices vary from free to \$600.

Here are some guidelines to help you plan financially for your education abroad:

- Research Program— Determine the best study abroad program type that meets your academic and personal needs.
- How much money will you need?—Add up your current on-campus costs, including tuition, housing/ rent, meals, transportation, and university fees.
 Then fill out the budget worksheet on the reverse side for a study abroad and compare that amount with the costs you are already paying for an on-campus education. This is how much more you will need to finance your program.
- Costs will vary depending on many factors, such as length and type of program and destination. To check

- Begin Planning—Be sure to meet with your family as well as your study abroad office and the Financial Wellness Center to discuss goals, budgeting and financial planning.
- Research Scholarships— Scholarships may be available. Check with the granting organization to see if they transfer to your study abroad program.
- Federal Financial Aid— Perkins Loans, SSIG grant Program, Pell Grants, FSEOG Grants and others can be used for study abroad. This money will be funneled through your home university.
